How long does it take to find the wanderer?

If law enforcement is called in a reasonable amount of time the average recovery time can be as low as 30 minutes.

What are the costs?

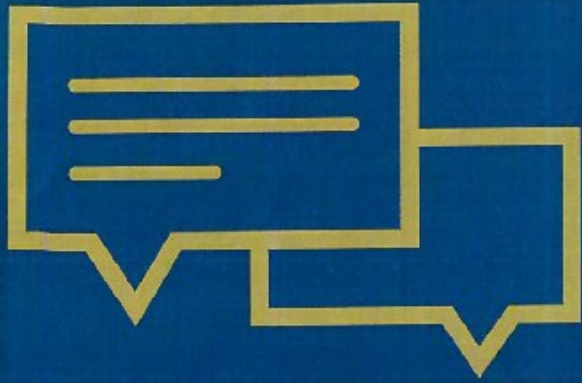

Project Lifesaver is a 501(c) 3 non-profit organization that partners with law enforcement.

Project Lifesaver devices provide timely response and reduce potential injury for adults and children who wander due to a cognitive condition.

The costs associated with Project Lifesaver are to pay for the technology, a one-year supply of batteries and a tester to ensure proper working condition.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

Clients enrolled in Project Lifesaver wear a small transmitter on the wrist that emits a frequency.

If an enrolled client goes missing, the caregiver notifies 911 and the device can be deployed to search the area.

The police department will only access a person's location given the notification that a person has gone missing.

Rescuers have both handheld and car mounted receivers to better locate missing persons wearing the device.
